

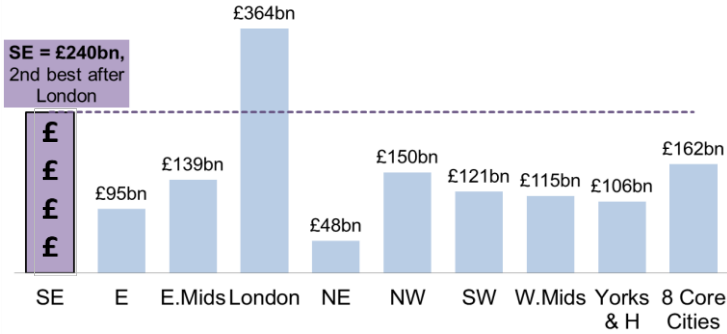

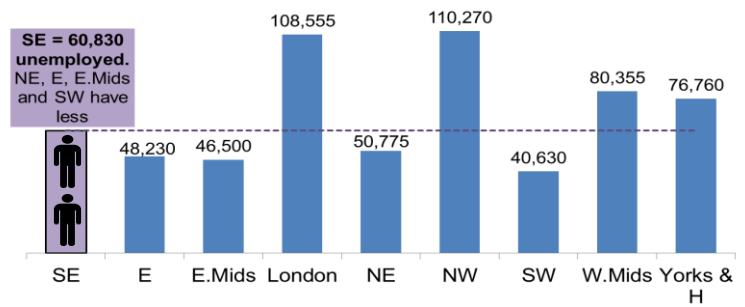
At **£240bn**, SE econ. output (GVA) is 2<sup>nd</sup> highest in England, and more than all 8 core cities combined.

Gross Value Added (GVA), Total - Workplace Based 2014



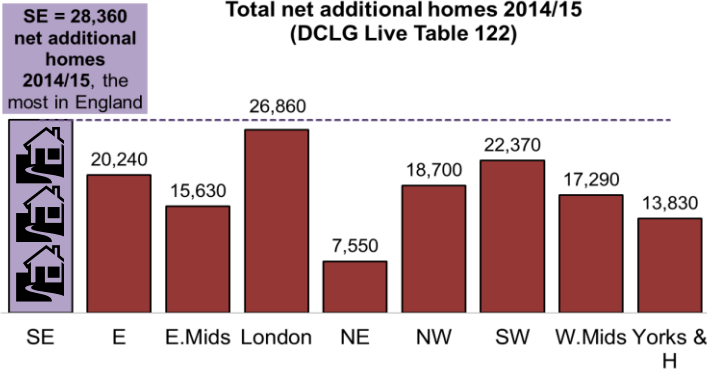
SE has **60,830** people claiming unemployment benefits - higher than East, E Mids, NE & SW.

Total number of people claiming unemployment benefits - March 2016



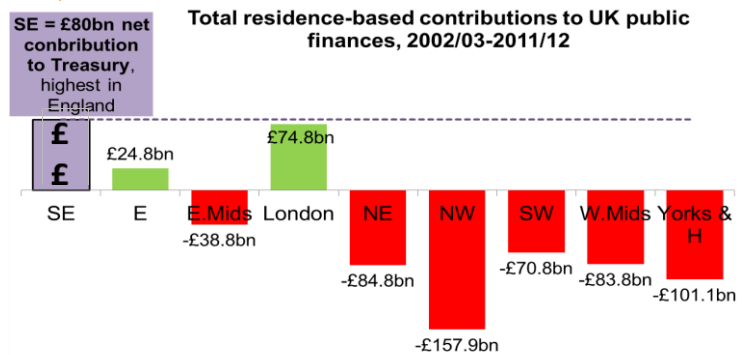
SE had the highest net addition of homes in 2014/15 at **28,360**, a significant 6500 increase on the previous year.

Total net additional homes 2014/15 (DCLG Live Table 122)



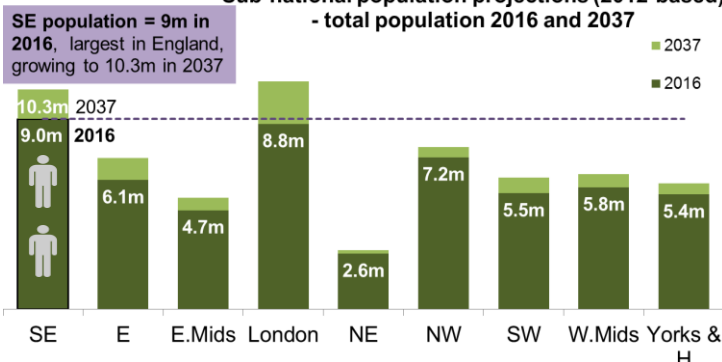
At **£80bn** between 2002/03 & 2011/12, SE makes highest net contribution to Treasury, £6bn more than London.

Total residence-based contributions to UK public finances, 2002/03-2011/12



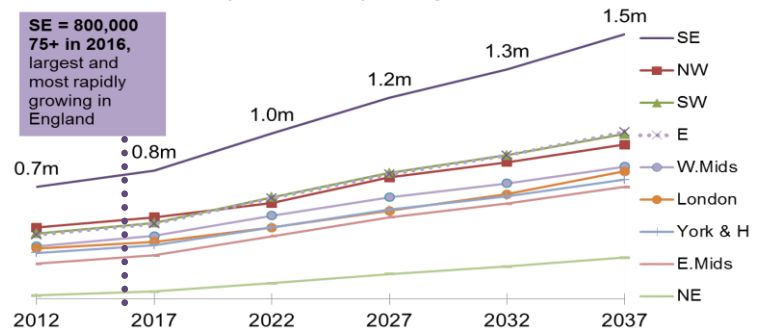
At **9.0m** in 2016, SE has UK's largest population, projected to grow to **10.3m** by 2037.

Sub-national population projections (2012-based) - total population 2016 and 2037



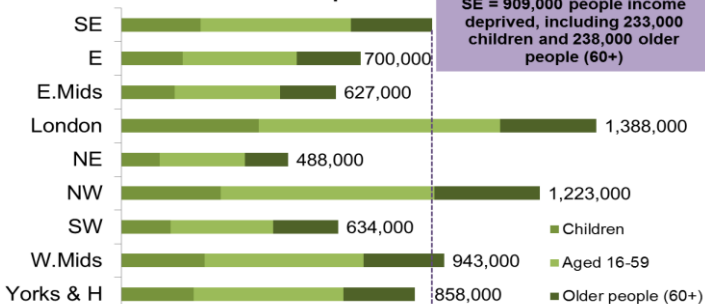
At **800,000** in 2016, the SE has UK's largest older population, with over-75s nearly doubling to **1.5m** by 2037.
