

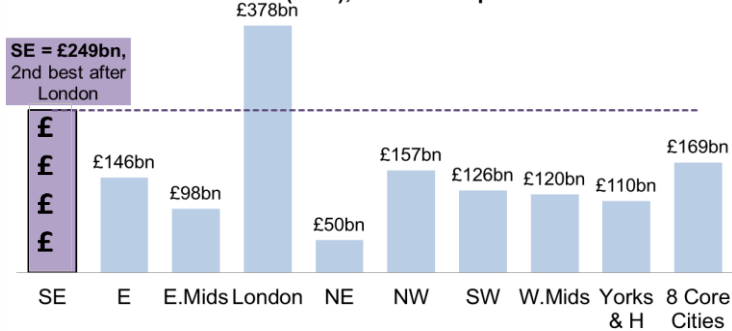

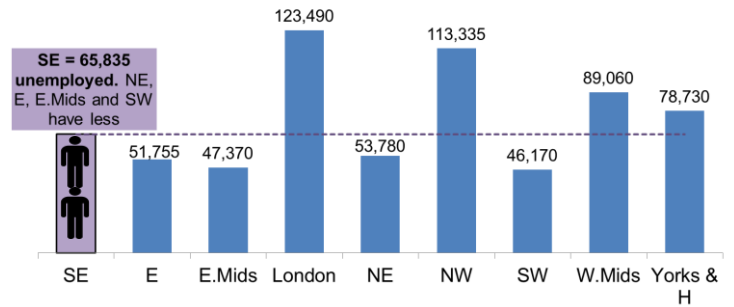
At **£249bn**, SE econ. output (GVA) is 2nd highest in England, and more than all 8 core cities combined.

Gross Value Added (GVA), Total - Workplace Based 2015



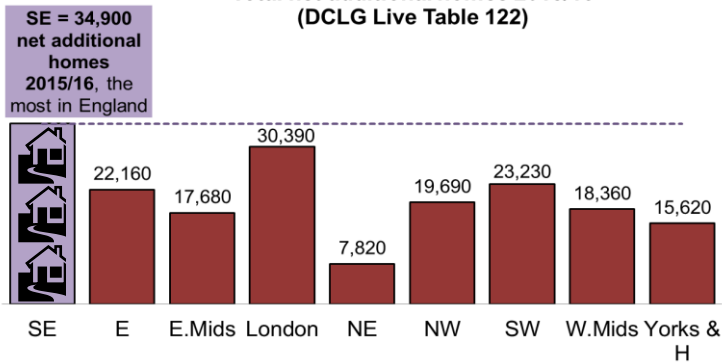
SE has **65,835** people claiming unemployment benefits - higher than NE, E, E Mids & SW; & 7% more than April 2016.

Total number of people claiming unemployment benefits - April 2017



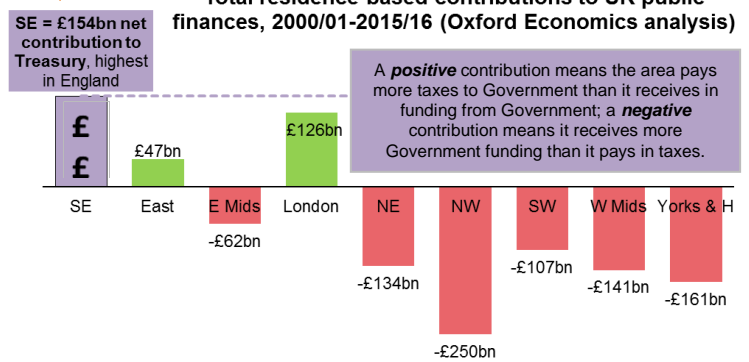
SE had the highest net addition of homes in 2015/16 at **34,900**, a significant 6400 increase on the previous year.

Total net additional homes 2015/16 (DCLG Live Table 122)



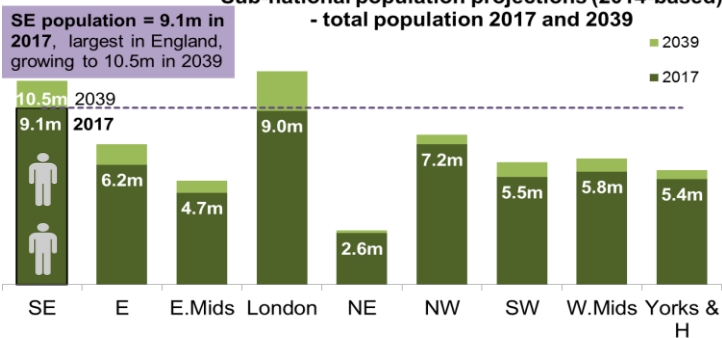
At **£154bn** between 2000/01 & 2015/16, SE makes highest net taxes contribution to Treasury, £28bn more than London.

Total residence-based contributions to UK public finances, 2000/01-2015/16 (Oxford Economics analysis)



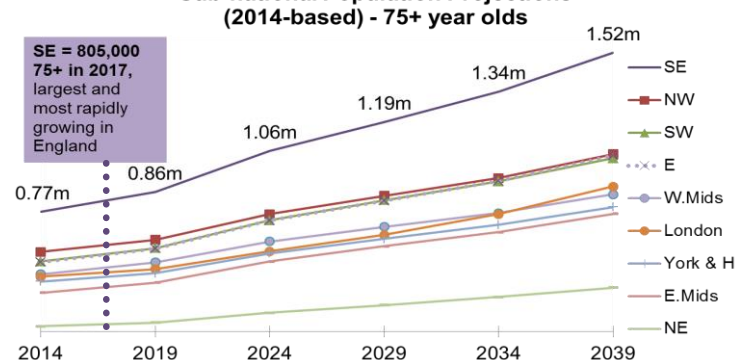
At **9.1m** in 2017, SE has UK's largest population, projected to grow to **10.5m** by 2039.

Sub-national population projections (2014-based) - total population 2017 and 2039



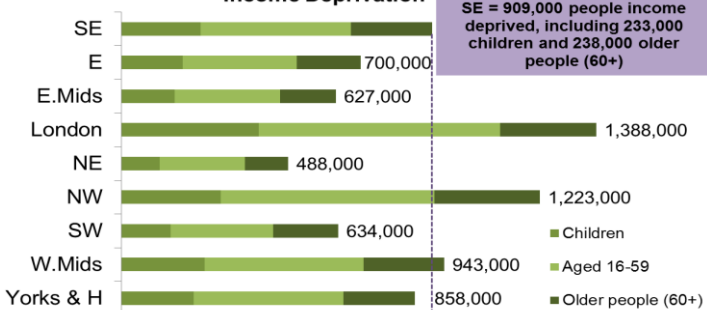
At **805,000** in 2017, the SE has UK's largest older population, with over-75s nearly doubling to **1.5m** by 2039.
