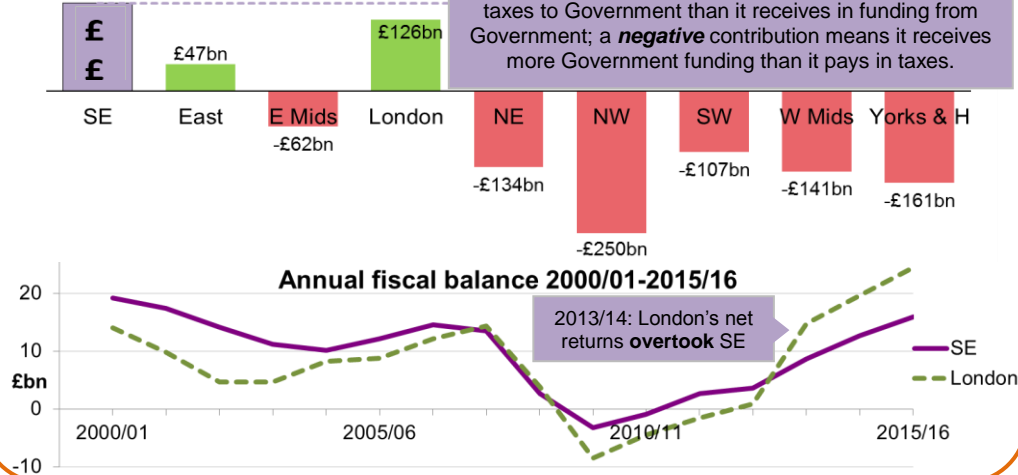

At **£154bn** between 2000/01 & 2015/16, SE made highest net tax contribution to Treasury, £28bn more than London. But London's returns have **overtaken SE** since 2013/14.

SE = £154bn net contribution to Treasury, highest in England

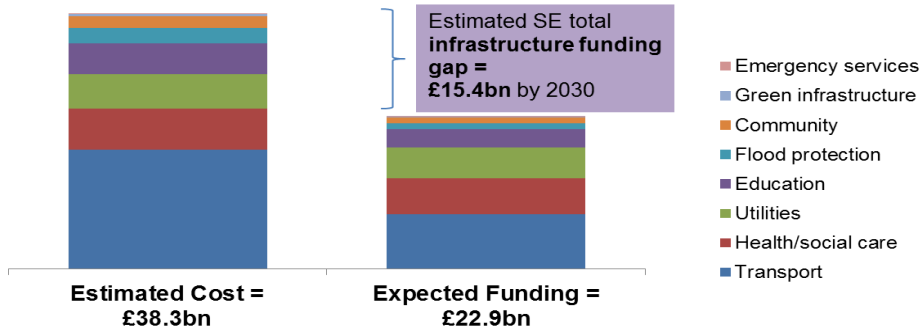
Total residence-based contributions to UK public finances, 2000/01-2015/16 (Source: Oxford Economics for SEEC)

A **positive** contribution means the area pays more taxes to Government than it receives in funding from Government; a **negative** contribution means it receives more Government funding than it pays in taxes.

SE infrastructure funding gap by 2030

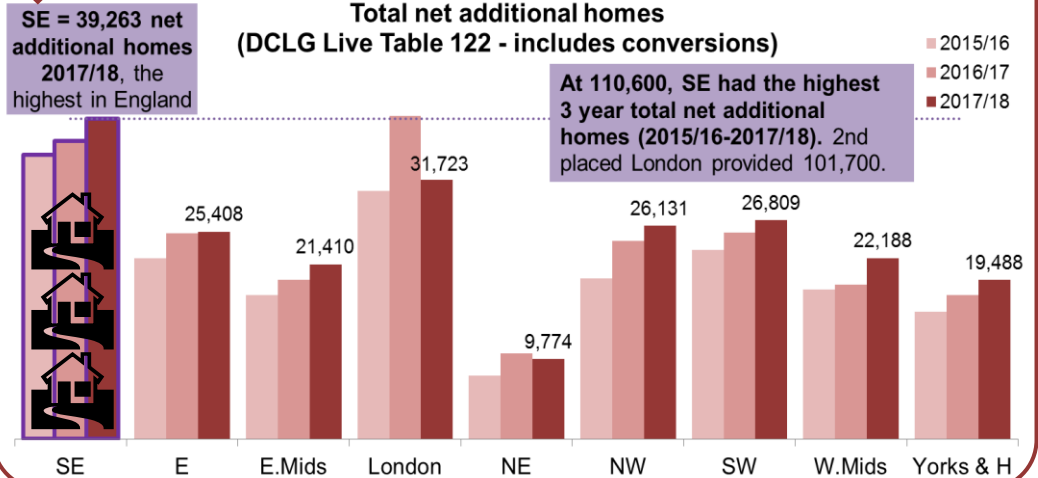

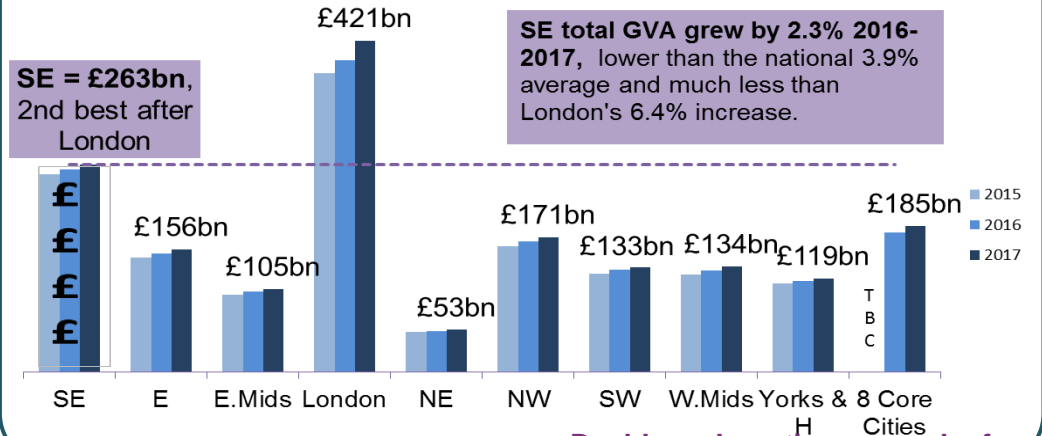

SE had the highest net addition of homes in 2017/18 at **39,263**, a significant 2,737 increase on the previous year.



At **£263bn** in 2017, SE economic output (GVA) is 2nd highest in England, and more than all 8 core cities combined.

Gross Value Added (GVA), Total - Workplace Based 2015-17



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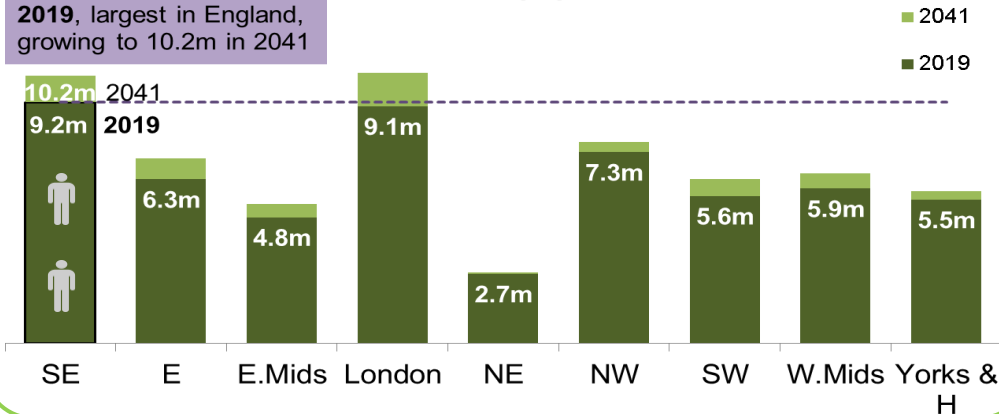
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At **9.2m** in 2019, SE has UK's largest population, projected to **grow to 10.2m by 2041**.

SE population = 9.2m in 2019, largest in England, growing to 10.2m in 2041

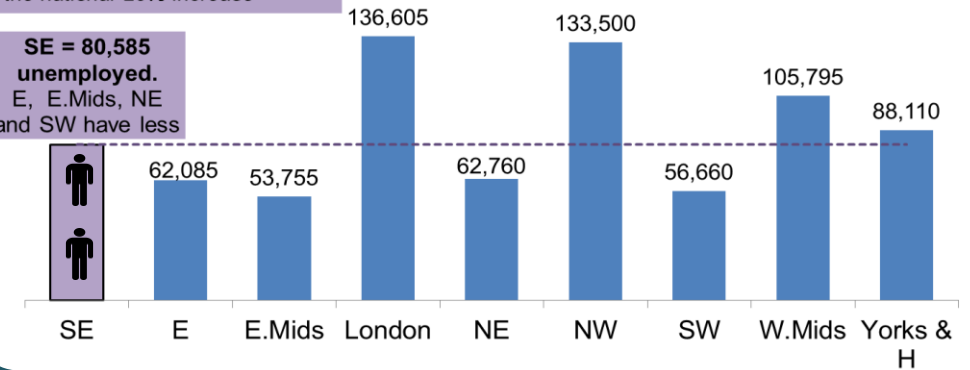


SE has **80,585** people claiming unemployment benefits - higher than E, E Mids, NE & SW; & 23% more than Oct 2017.

SE claimants increased by 23% during the last year, **higher than the national 20% increase**

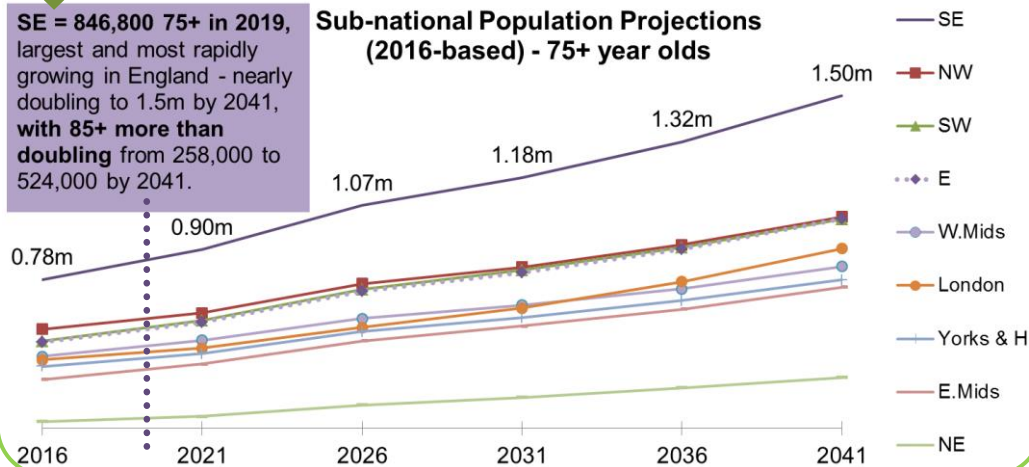
SE = 80,585 unemployed. E, E.Mids, NE and SW have less



At **846,800** in 2019, the SE has UK's largest older population, with over-75s nearly doubling to **1.5m by 2041**.

Sub-national Population Projections (2016-based) - 75+ year olds

SE = 846,800 75+ in 2019, largest and most rapidly growing in England - nearly doubling to 1.5m by 2041, with 85+ more than doubling from 258,000 to 524,000 by 2041.



SE has **287,800** people with no qualifications – more than East, E Mids, North East and the South West.
